

Completing the RAP Reflection Survey – FAQs

What is the Reflection Survey and why should it be responded to?

Responding to the Reflection Survey is a required component of the Narragunnawali RAP development process. It is an opportunity to reflect on your school or early learning service's reconciliation journey to date, and provides the RAP Working Group with a snapshot of the current state of reconciliation in your school or service.

The set of Reflection Survey questions are divided into three areas in alignment with the [Narragunnawali RAP framework](#): in the classroom, around the school, and with the community.

Who should complete the Reflection Survey?

It is generally most effective for the Reflection Survey to be completed together with the whole RAP Working Group. Your Working Group may also like to consider sharing [a copy of the Reflection Survey questions](#) with wider members of your school or early learning service community prior to entering the 'average' or 'aggregate' responses online. While all Working Group members will be able to view your Reflection Survey responses, note that only those who are listed as a Chair of your Working Group will be able to enter and submit the Survey responses within the Narragunnawali platform.

When should the Reflection Survey be completed?

Reflection Survey responses can only be entered and edited while your RAP is in draft. While your RAP Working Group can complete the Survey at any point in time during your RAP drafting process, it generally a useful early step in this process which can help to inform and inspire your next steps.

As an important part of refreshing your RAP, you will also be prompted to re-complete the Reflection Survey every 12 months after your RAP's latest publication date. Doing so will provide you with the opportunity to compare Survey responses over time and track progress made in your school or early learning service's reconciliation journey
